King's College London is a public research university located in London, United Kingdom, and a founding college and member institution of the federal University of London.

The history of King's College London, on its own, spans over 185 years since it was founded by Royal Charter. King George IV granted such charter on 14 August 1829. The full history, however, includes the medical schools that now constitute King's College London GKT School of Medical Education.

# UNIVERSITY COLLEGE LONDON

University College London (ESDT) 1826



University College London is the third-largest university in the United Kingdom by. UCL is London's leading multidisciplinary university, with more than 13,000 staff and 42,000 students from 150 different countries. Founded in **1826** in the heart of London, UCL was founded to open up education to those who had previously been excluded from it. London University's first Warden was [Leonard Horner](#), who was the first scientist to head a British university.<sup>[</sup>

# UNIVERSITY OF CHESTER

University of Chester (ESDT) 1839



The university was founded as Chester Diocesan Training College in **1839** by a distinguished group of local leading figures in the Church of England, including future Prime Ministers William Ewart Gladstone and the 14th Earl of Derby.

# UNIVERSITY OF EDINBURGH

University of Edinburgh (ESDT) 1852



University of Edinburgh is the eighth-largest university in the United Kingdom by. It was founded in 1583 as “the Town's College” under Presbyterian auspices by the Edinburgh town council under a charter granted in **1582** by King James VI, who later became King James I of England.

The university played an important role in leading Edinburgh to its reputation as a chief intellectual centre during the [Age of Enlightenment](#), and helped give the city the nickname of the [Athens of the North](#).



# CARDIFF UNIVERSITY

Cardiff University (ESDT) 1883



Cardiff University is the 10th-largest university in the United Kingdom by. Cardiff is the first university in Wales to become a member of the Russell Group of research-intensive universities, working with other leading universities across the UK to help develop the higher education sector.

# UNIVERSITY OF SALFORD

The university's origins can be traced to the opening in 1896 of the Royal Technical Institute, Salford, a merger of Salford Working Men's College (founded in 1858) and Pendleton Mechanics' Institute (founded in 1850).

# LIVERPOOL SCHOOL OF TROPICAL MEDICINE

**Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine (ESTD) 1898**



LSTM was founded in November 1898 by Sir Alfred Lewis Jones, a influential shipping magnate, when Liverpool was a prominent port city with extensive trade with overseas regions such as West and Southern Africa.

The Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine is a higher education institution with degree awarding powers and registered charity located in Liverpool, United Kingdom.

Established in 1898, it was the first institution in the world dedicated to research and teaching in tropical medicine



# UNIVERSITY OF SHEFFIELD

University of Sheffield (ESTD) 1905



The University of Sheffield Students' Union was founded in 1906 and has nearly three hundred student societies and nearly fifty sports teams.

The University of Sheffield is a public research university in Sheffield, South Yorkshire, England. It received its royal charter in 1905 as successor to the University College of Sheffield, which was established in 1897 by the merger of Sheffield Medical School, Firth College and Sheffield Technical School.

# TEESSIDE UNIVERSITY

Teesside University (ESTD) 1930



Teesside University is founded on a rich heritage, which has influenced its development into the dynamic, energetic and innovative institution it is today.

Originally *founded* as Constantine College, the institution was officially opened by the Prince of Wales, the future King Edward VIII, on 2 July 1930.

# QUEEN MARY UNIVERSITY OF LONDON

It dates back to the foundation of London Hospital Medical College in 1785.

# UNIVERSITY OF DUNDEE

# UNIVERSITY OF GLASGOW

University of Glasgow (ESTD) 1451



Founded in 1451 by Papal Bull, the university was situated in the High Street for 400 years before moving to its present site on Gilmore hill in 1870. The fourth oldest university in the United Kingdom after Oxford, Cambridge and Durham.

In the 19th century the university's medical school became internationally famous with such teachers as Joseph Lister, professor of surgery, who did his pioneering work in antiseptics there. William Thomson (Lord Kelvin), the celebrated physicist, was professor of natural philosophy at the university in 1846–99. There are eight faculties: arts, divinity, law and financial studies, medicine, science, social sciences, veterinary medicine.

# UNIVERSITY OF LEEDS

University of Leeds (ESTD) 1904



University of Leeds is the fifth-largest university in the United Kingdom by. The University of Leeds was founded in **1904**, but its origins go back to the nineteenth century with the founding of the Leeds School of Medicine in 1831 and then the Yorkshire College of Science in 1874.

# UNIVERSITY OF BRISTOL

University of Bristol (ESTD) 1595



English universities, Bristol evolved from earlier institutions, most notably University College, Bristol (founded 1876), Bristol Medical School (1833) and the Merchant Ventures' Technical College (founded as a school 1595 and which became the university engineering faculty).

The University of Bristol has taken part for the past four years, and has been successful in winning funding, which was used by the university to provide initiatives and awards for students who get involved in research. Students are encouraged to work together and Bristol has created an 'open door' arrangement with Cardiff, Exeter and Plymouth Universities so that students can arrange visits to see what research is being carried out.



# IMPERIAL COLLEGE LONDON

Imperial College London (ESTD) 1907



In 1907, the Royal College of Science, the Royal School of Mines and the City & Guilds College were combined to form Imperial College London.

Imperial College London is a public research university located in London, England. In 1851, Prince Albert built his vision for a cultural area composed of the Victoria and Albert Museum, Natural History Museum, Royal Albert Hall, Royal Colleges, and the Imperial Institute.
